wheel each time as some of our clubs may have already held successful events.



Here we have our first Lions Convention for year 2020-2021 and my first year of Convention Chair! What a way to ease me into my first convention hey!

So while we are at alert level 2 we have many restrictions in place that we **must** adhere too. I'm sure we will have some hiccups but we will work through them as best we can. This is our first event in a pandemic so bare with us!

Due to Public Health guidelines we have to limit our registration for cabinet meeting and banquet to 100 people. The hotel can accommodate more than that but for meeting space we are only allowed 100 people/Lions members, because only 100 Lions members can attend cabinet meeting and banquet supper your club will only be able to send 1 Lions club representative. Therefore you must pre-register for the event in order to attend. If you do not pre-register before the deadline you will not be able to attend the event. Once pre-registration is completed we will let you know when you can book your room.

We have also decided to keep a wait list for the convention because we have a restriction of 100 people. We will do a random draw of names on the wait list and then contact the members on Thanksgiving weekend letting them know they can make arrangements for convention.

Once we have pre-registration taken care of you will receive an email outlining the fine details of our convention weekend.

As previously mentioned about the hotel being able to accommodate more than 100 people we still need members to be cognizant of socializing in your hotel room. We realize our conventions are for reconnecting with friends and members from other clubs but we are still dealing with a health pandemic and need to encourage everyone to keep to your bubble and not host or promote "welcome rooms". This will be hard for us Lions to adhere to this but we are a recognizable organization and we want to promote a positive image that we are still here to serve and following the public health guidelines in doing so.

Our convention will be different this year but we will do our best to still make it an enjoyable event.




COVID-19



Becoming a Digital Lion

They say the only thing constant is change, and things sure changed this year. Photos are another way to promote Lionism in the digital age. A picture on facebook can be worth a thousand words. In normal times, we would probably see smiling faces, but with face masks on, we can at most hope to see a glint in their eyes. Provincial regulations remind us that masks must be worn in all public indoor spaces, and masks should also be worn outdoors if social distancing cannot be observed. And, generally speaking, we should seek permission of the people in the photo before its even posted online. This is a very common practice, and some groups actually maintain a file with "Permissions/Photo Release". Just be aware that not everyone wants to be on Facebook!

When taking a photo, or are going to be part of one, scan the scene. When this picture is posted on social media, will Newfoundlanders see a group of individuals that promote and support the province's health measures? Content and photos on social media sites such as Facebook can live for a long time, and be seen by a lot of people. We must be seen as a group that is respectful of others, including their health. So please remember to wear your mask, and keep 6 feet apart. This just means that you need to be more creative!






